

#### Kevin Kozacek, Music Director

Originally from Colorado, Kevin Kozacek graduated from the University of Northern Colorado, where he earned a Bachelor's degree in Music Education with an emphasis in choral conducting, under the tutelage of Dr. Howard Skinner. Mr. Kozacek received both his Master of Arts and Master of Music degrees from Northern Arizona University, studying orchestral conducting under Dr. Nicholas Ross and Dr. Daniel O'Bryant. He has additionally studied conducting under Maestros Lawrence Golan, Don Thulean, Apo Hsu,

Harold Farberman, Raymond Harvey, and Zvonimir Hacko. Mr. Kozacek has guest-conducted orchestras in Kiev, Ukraine, and Krasnoyarsk, Russia, and been invited to conduct workshops and high school honor orchestras in local Arizona school districts. Mr. Kozacek has taught public school music in grades K-I2, and directed theater, instrumental ensembles, and choral groups in churches and communities in England, Nebraska, Colorado, Texas, and Arizona. He has served as Artistic Director for ProMusica Arizona Chorale and Orchestra in Phoenix, and Music Director for the Verde Valley Sinfonietta in Sedona. In 2012, Mr. Kozacek was invited to serve as the founding Music Director for North Valley Symphony Orchestra. Kevin and his wife Cindy have two grown sons, Matt and Chris, and three grandchildren, Audrey, Owen and Ezekiel.



#### Ellen Hansbury, Concertmaster

Ellen began studying the violin at the age of four. At the College Conservatory of Music, University of Cincinnati, she went on to major in violin performance under the direction of Kurt Sassmannshaus. # 101099 THE UNIVERSE Program Notes

Richard Strauss (1864-1949) was a composer during the German romantic period and early 20th century, and was known as the successor to Wagner and Liszt. He began his compositional output at the young age of seven, which flourished for nearly eighty years! He wrote in numerous forms, including tonepoems, opera, symphonies and chamber music. He is best known for his very progressive operas (especially <code>Salomé</code>), his two horn concertos, and his tone poem <code>Also sprach Zarathustra</code>, which was written in 1896, and is based on Nietzsche's philosophical work of the same name. <code>Thus spoke Zarathustra</code> deals with Nietzsche's beliefs concerning the rise of science and humanism, and the demise of religion. The opening chapter of his book was called "prelude"or "dawn" — Strauss titled his initial fanfare "Sunrise" in his program notes. The short movement was famously used by Stanley Kubrick in the 1968 film <code>2001: A Space Odyssey</code>.

**Star Trek** was the brain-child of writer Gene Roddenberry, who patterned his stories after *Gulliver's Travels*, providing adventurous and suspenseful episodes that included a "morality tale." *Star Trek* first aired in 1966, which included three seasons and 79 episodes. Since that *Original Series*, there have been nine spin-off television series, including over 770 episodes, plus an animated series of 22 episodes. The film franchise has included six films featuring the *Original Series* cast, four films in the *Next Generation* series, and three in the *Kelvin Timeline/Prequel* series. Numerous composers have been employed during the fifty-five year history of *Star Trek*, but often the original theme by Alexander Courage is either used for thematic variation, or incorporated into the film or series during the titles. It is estimated that *Star Trek* in all its media forms (not including merchandising sales) has amassed over \$10.6 billion in revenue.

**Gustav Holst's (1874-1934)** *The Planets* was written in 1915. It is an often held misconception that the work is about the planets themselves. But Holst conceived the idea of *The Planets* partly as a result of his interest in astrology (not astronomy). Each planet is represented with a distinct character based on the astrological individual. "Mars" encompasses a persistent, uneven rhythm of five beats, providing a sense of battle music. "Venus" opens with a lovely horn solo, creating the prevalent mood of peaceful resignation. "Jupiter" explodes with a splash of excitement and humor, and is renowned for its central melody "Thaxted," which was later used

in the patriotic hymn "I Vow to Thee, My Country." Holst originally wanted to make his living as a pianist, but suffered neuritis in his right arm. He turned to composition, but struggled making a living solely on that income. He finally settled on composing and teaching at St. Paul's Girls' School, and at Morley College.

Eric Whitacre (b. 1970) is an American composer, having earned his degree in composition from UNLV. Whitacre is known primarily for his numerous choral works, especially Lux Aurumque, which means "light and gold." The album Light & Gold, which includes the title song, was awarded a Grammy in 2012. Whitacre has also been very successful in creating and recording virtual choir projects — his most recent project during the COVID lockdown involved over 17,000 singers from 129 countries. **Deep Field** was written in 2015 for orchestra, virtual choir, and cell phone app. The piece was inspired by the pictures taken of the deep field by the Hubble telescope in 1995. The deep field (known as HDF) is located in a region of our sky in the Ursa Major (Big Dipper) constellation. The pictures of that region, followed later by pictures of a deep field in the southern sky (HDFS), have significantly changed scientists understanding of the complexity of our universe. We are so pleased to be able to present this piece, and ask our audience members to help us "create" sound that represents our vast universe.

John Williams (b. 1932) is arguably the most prolific and important film score composer of all time. Williams has won 25 Grammy Awards, seven British Academy Film Awards, five Academy Awards and four Golden Globe Awards for his works. He has received 53 Academy Award nominations, the second most nominated behind Walt Disney. He is primarily known for his film scores for Star Wars, Jaws, Close Encounters of the Third Kind, Superman, E.T., Indiana Jones, the first two Jurassic Park films, Schindler's List, Saving Private Ryan, and the first three Harry Potter films. The Star Wars saga of films began with Episode IV: A New Hope, released in 1977, followed by The Empire Strikes Back and Return of the Jedi in 1980 and 1983. Episodes I, II, and III, The Phantom Menace, Attack of the Clones, and Revenge of the Sith were released in 1999, 2002 and 2005. NVSO will be performing the saga in the order of the story, not in the order of release. The estimates of earnings easily make Star Wars the most successful franchise in history — just the merchandising alone is over \$20 billion in gross sales.
